

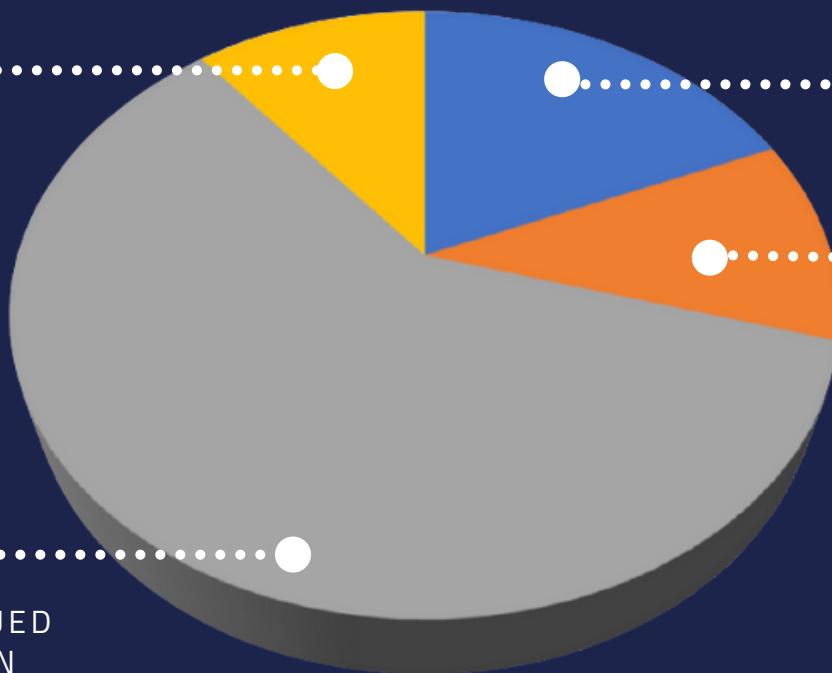

Construction Progress

Thank you once again on behalf of all the CVV Trustees, for showering your blessings on us through your generosity. As promised, I want to provide an update on the progress of the construction of our new campus:

- The second-floor slab for the girls hostel and first-floor slab for the boys hostel have been completed and all the civil work will be finished by March 2022 and May 2022 respectively.
- We are targeting to make both hostels available for occupation by the start of the 2022-23 academic year in August 2022. The capacity for each hostel block is close to 200 students and facilities will be comfortable, safe and serene.
- The rock excavation is nearly complete for the academic block and the foundation work will start shortly with target completion in 2023. A capacity of 2000 students is what the academic block can house in one sitting.
- The dining block contract will be awarded imminently and construction will start by February 2022.
- At CVV we are working on making the campus environment friendly. We plan to incorporate features such as rain water harvesting, solar systems, recycling, biogas and organic farming.

We are eager to welcome you to the campus and I invite all those planning to visit Kerala (subject to covid restrictions) to make it a point to visit CVV in person and see how we are progressing.

Please do keep spreading the word to others who would like to co-create this remarkable institution with us! We look forward to welcoming more to the CVV family.

Young Budding Philosopher from CVV Takes Second Place

K. G. Aditya Anshuman (third-year BBA) came second in the International Philosophy Essay Writing Competition conducted by Philosophy Today – an institute established by scholars working in and for this field.

Over 100 were assessed from various reputable universities across the globe. Aditya's essay was inspired by a minor course he took in his first year, and was a critique of J. L. Mackie's argument against the existence of an omnipotent, omnibenevolent God (popularly called 'The Problem of Evil' argument against God).

Admission into the prestigious UN Geneva: Graduate Study Programme

Sri. Arun Kumar S. (final-year, M.A. PPG) was selected to be part of the 59th United Nations Information Service's Graduate Study Programme (GSP); the longest running educational programme of the UN.

Arun joined youth from over 100 countries at the Palais des Nations in Geneva and immersed himself in lectures, research, group work and visits to Geneva-based institutions all focused around the GSP theme for 2021: "Post-COVID World: Reset, Resilience, Recovery".

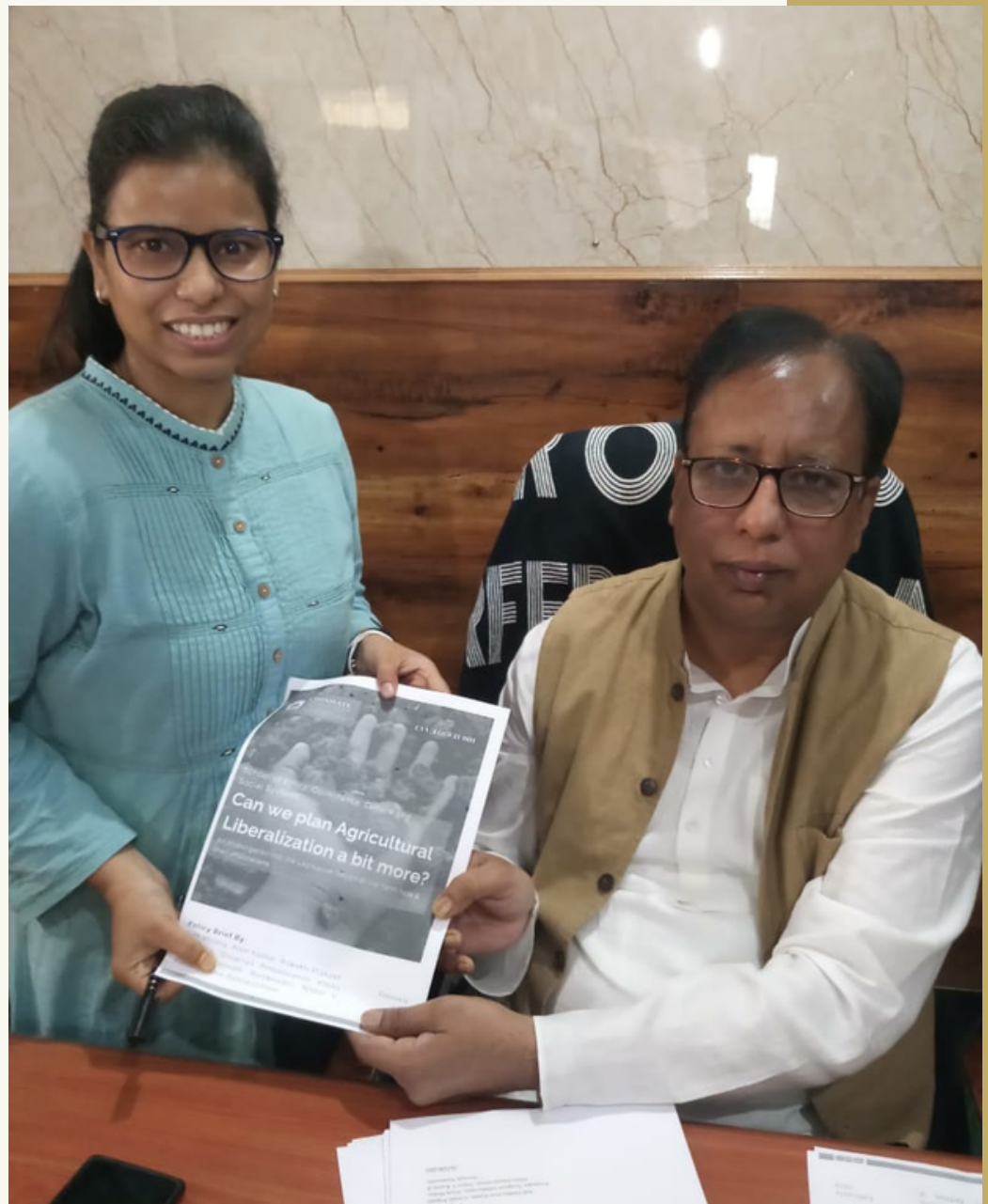


Policy Submissions to Members of Parliament: *'Can we plan Agricultural Liberalisation a bit more?'*

CVV's students have been extremely engaged with discussions surrounding the farm laws, identifying benefits as well as examining them for possible areas of improvement. They haven't stopped at mere talk; they have taken it to the next level as well: Priyanka Walter, a student of the MA Public Policy and Governance programme (M.A.PPG), handed over a policy brief on these farm laws to Dr. Sanjay Jaiswal, Member of Parliament, Lok Sabha, Bihar, in March 2021.

The policy brief, titled 'Can we plan Agricultural Liberalisation a bit more?', was prepared and submitted as per the call given by the Committee on Farm Laws, appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide their judgement dated 12 December 2020.

CVV's first-year M.A.PPG students Priyanka Walter, Arth Mishra, Arun Kumar, Aswathi Pakash, Sivapriya Ambalavanan and Veena Mahor worked on this brief, along with Assistant Professors Sreenath Namboodiri, Nithin V. Kumar and Nithin Ramakrishnan from the School of Ethics, Governance, Culture and Social Systems.



Presentation at TISS' Centre for Social Entrepreneurship

CVV student, Aditya Raja (third-year B.A. Applied Psychology) presented his joint research paper on 'Radical Innovation Using Non-Traditional Enterprise Design' at a conference hosted by the Centre for Social Entrepreneurship at TISS (Tata Institute of Social Sciences). The paper was worked on jointly by Aditya and Ismail Akban (Assistant Professor), Symbiosis International.

The paper analyses the hallmark of radical innovation and the non-traditional structure of social enterprise design through the lens of applied ontology, classifications, knowledge management principles, market-based characteristics, enterprise design and business innovation theory.



Aditya Speaks at TEDx Queen's University Canada!

Aditya Raja (BA Applied Psychology (Hons.)) was selected from a vast pool of applicants to speak at a TEDx conference organised by Queen's University Canada on the topic 'Broken Crayons Can Still Colour'. He covered ideas around decision making, returning to normal life after a sudden stop and igniting change via tools of motivation, expressive writing, and the faith system.

Apart from being a psychology enthusiast Aditya was ranked one of the 100 Most Influential Global Youth by CMO Asia (the only global network of executives for senior corporate marketing leaders). He has also represented India at the World Youth Summit where he was awarded the National Youth Icon award.

Community Outreach



At CVV SEVA (Service, Empathy, Virtue and Attentiveness) is of utmost importance and we are committed to empowering and rising with the community in which we exist. The examples below provide a glimpse of how our students are contributing their compassion, leadership, communication and problem-solving skills towards various community outreach activities.



CVV JOINS NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

CVV joined the NSS, an initiative led by the Indian Government enabling students to take part in various community service activities and programmes. CVV believes that providing students hands on experience in giving back to those in situations of disadvantage, will enable them to make an enormous difference to society and build their skills and character. Their first initiative is to provide digital training to 38 women from the Edakattuvayal Grama Panchayat, thus empowering them to find work and provide for their family.

SVADHYAYA: JOURNEY OF TOGETHERNESS

A week-long online camp 'Svadyaya: Journey of Togetherness' was organised by CVV for high-school students all over India which focused on holistic development, especially in relation to enhanced learning.

Over 250 students enrolled and the sessions covered topics such as Stage Fear (Communication Skills), Memory Development, Stress Management, Creativity, Problem Solving and Decision Making.



WE THINK DIGITAL: A WORKSHOP ON DIGITAL LITERACY AND ONLINE SAFETY FOR WOMEN'

To promote Digital Literacy among women, CVV and the National Commission for Women in collaboration with Cyber Peace Foundation and Facebook organised a four-day free workshop titled 'We Think Digital' in January 2021. There were over 1187 registrants and sessions covered included Understanding Data and Digital Footprint, Responsible Online Behaviour, Fighting Misinformation, and Cybercrime and Redressal. Feedback from participants showed that they felt empowered and better equipped to lead a safer digital life.

A few months into the program, the Edakaatuvayal Grama Panchayat - where the tutoring was taking place - organised a ceremony to honour the volunteering students, as the learners had benefited incredibly because of the program.

SOCIAL ROOM FOR STUDY GROUP (SRSG)

SRSG focuses on teaching the basics of English and Maths to youngsters living around CVV, so they are afforded better opportunities in life. The classes also provide an opportunity for the young talents to express their passions and hobbies. Using both online and offline resources, CVV ensures that the individual requirements of each child are met and they are provided with the tools to break free of their limitations.

IKS CENTRE FOR EXCELLENCE

CVV's Centre for Excellence in research and applied Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) has accomplished the following:

- Creating proposals on how to re-engineer IKS in areas of education, economics and law.
- Revamping the syllabus for IKS for undergraduate students, which focuses on:
 - reviving pride in India and its achievements
 - allowing student to unfold their innate potential through the study of IKS
 - developing an appreciation of ancient heritage of empirical sciences
 - highlighting insights of success from the Gita, Ramayana and Mahabharata.
- Organising a conference on hybrid learning-which will enable academicians, faculty and students to be prepared to teach any subject, including IKS.
- Supporting and guiding Ph.D. student on their thesis areas related to application of IKS in modern times.

SANSKRIT TALENT SEARCH

CVV launched the first संस्कृत-प्रतिभा-परीक्षा or Sanskrit Talent Search, a national level competition for identifying Sanskrit talent. Over 250 students from across the globe – from grades 10 to 12 – participated in the event. The top ten scorers at each level were presented the titled, 'चिन्मय-बाल-संस्कृत-प्रतिभा' along with cash prizes. Among the prize winners Alok Kumar joined CVV in 2021 and a number were very keen to join the Sanskrit Integrated Masters Programme in 2022.

ACADEMIC ENGAGEMENT

The Academic Centre of Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR), New Delhi, organised a week-long National Online Workshop on 'Vivekachudamani: Greatest Text of Indian Philosophy'. Former Dean of Faculty, Prof. Gauri Mahulikar was invited to give a special lecture on the अनुबन्धचतुष्टय methodology. Dr. Tulasi Kumar Joshi, Assistant Professor at CVV's School of Vedic Knowledge Systems, was also invited to speak and covered scholarly insights on several areas of this brilliant text.

Dr. Vinayak Rajat Bhat (Asst. Prof. and Head of School of Vedic Knowledge Systems) and Adv. Nithin Ramakrishnan (Asst. Prof. for Law at the School of Ethics, Governance, Culture and Social Systems) brought together expertise from their respective knowledge fields and wrote an article on 'Epidemics: Public Health and State Responsibilities: What Sastras Say'. This content-rich article makes for an interesting read as it covers both traditional knowledge and the policies of a government.

Integrating Indian Knowledge and Contemporary Thought

Here at CVV, students are taught to think and be inquisitive to identify the treasures from Vedas, Upanishads, Ayurveda, Bhagavad Gita, Ramayana and also from Indian Psychology which can be fused with the Western psychological concepts, theories, and practice prescriptions so as to generate a stronger synergy and make our understanding of psychology and its application robust.

For example, Lord Krishna in the Gita is considered as the best counsellor that India had across time. While Krishna was applying all the counselling techniques that modern day counsellors use, the philosophical underpinnings and proclamations in the Gita still remain matchless.

CVV psychology students are taught and trained to integrate the electrifying philosophy of human existence,

selflessness, and the concept of karma-yoga (duty) – which Lord Krishna expounded upon – in different forms of counselling and psychotherapy. Lord Krishna’s conversation with Arjuna, His take-home exercises to him, and finally the unflinching support that He offers to Arjuna to decide upon his course of action is nothing but the highest level of the Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) which is so popular these days across the world.

The students at CVV get an added advantage of integrating the CBT process which is developed in the West with the cognitive components which are considered as higher level of cognitive re-structuring in Gita.

In a nutshell it can be comfortably said that CVV psychology graduates will be a notch up in terms of their depth and breadth of knowledge, in Western Psychology and IKS and skills to fuse them to create a synergy at a level which can only be generated by CVVians!

Centre for Avadhānam

A Centre for the promotion, patronage and performances of the unique art form of Avadhānam



Avadhanam was a popular literary performance in ancient India. It exhibits through entertainment the performer's superior cognitive abilities such as powers of observation, memory, multitasking, reasoning and creativity, through tasks that focus on multiple thematic areas including literature, poetry, music, mathematical calculations, puzzle-solving etc.

For example, a task can include formulating a poem spontaneously using specific meter, themes, forms and words, while keeping a count of a bell ringing at random. No external memory aids are allowed while performing these tasks, except the person's mind!

Dedicated efforts of connoisseurs have reinvigorated this art form in the recent past. However, if this legacy is to continue, the skills need to be passed on to a newer generation and the public from all parts of the country needs to be made aware of the nuances of this art.

WORLD-CLASS EDUCATION BUILT ON INDIAN WISDOM

It is in this context that CVV launched the 'Centre for Avadhanam', a joint collaboration between Indic Academy and Chinmaya University under the directorship of Prof. Ramakrishna Pajathaya, which will focus on bringing this remarkable art form to a larger audience (across India and abroad) and find future 'avadhāni'(s).

It will also foster interdisciplinary research spanning the fields of literary arts, extempore poetry, rhetoric and prosody of different languages, creativity and more. In addition, the Centre will explore the cognitive processes involved in an avadhānam performance such as feats of memory, spontaneous literary creativity, effortless and enjoyable multi-tasking and ease under a stressful situation with multiple, simultaneous challenges. The Centre will also contribute to improve the quality of contemporary Sanskrit literature as well as contemporary poetry in other languages.



New Initiatives



MENTORSHIP

CVV is fully aware of its sacred responsibility towards learners. It has thus implemented a distinct Student Mentorship Programme, where every single student is assigned a faculty mentor who will be their guide and their close advisor for the duration of their Programme. The Mentorship Programme seeks to focus and motivate students to achieve learning goals and thereby improve their academic performance, generate interest in extracurricular activities and provide them with information on preparatory and other special courses.

Beyond this, it also seeks to improve their leadership skills, motivating them not just towards their future career development, but also enabling them to gain confidence and bravely meet challenges in their professional and personal life.

Further, students who exhibit a specific talent may be guided to become 'CVV Future Leaders', via special support in leadership, communication, community engagement, interpersonal relations and more. The Mentorship Programme is an important part of what makes the students of CVV truly unique.



INNOVATION AND BUSINESS INCUBATION CELL

The last decade has seen an unprecedented growth in opportunities for start-ups and independent business ventures. With rapid change across most fields of work, there is an ever-increasing emphasis on innovation and entrepreneurship to fuel economic growth. And yet, when budding entrepreneurs start out, they often need the right kind of support and backing, to ensure they have guidance and know-how as they try to establish their enterprise.

The proposed Innovation and Business Incubation Cell (IBIC) at CVV intends to do exactly this, by encouraging University's graduates to become active partners in the economic development process of the nation and the world. It seeks to promote the development of knowledge-based and innovation-driven enterprises, the execution of bold ideas generating fresh employment opportunities, and to inculcate a culture of innovation-driven entrepreneurship.

The IBIC will develop outreach and extension activities, and build a vibrant start-up ecosystem by establishing a network between academia, financial institutions, industries, and other institutions. Further, it will provide cost-effective, value-added services to start-ups, such as mentoring, legal aid, and advisories on financial, technical, and intellectual property-related services. The IBIC is intended to be launched at CVV later this year. It will benefit not just the students of CVV, but also its alumni, faculty members, and local communities around the University.





INDIAN PERSPECTIVE ON HEALTH TIME AND LIFESTYLE

The workshop was conducted by Dr. Vinayak Rajat Bhat (Head, School of Vedic Knowledge Systems) with 21 participants from across India, US and Australia.

Topics covered included:

- Ayurvedic way of leading a healthy and happy life
- The body constitutions
- How individuals can manage their daily and seasonal routines based on Ayurveda
- The importance of sleep management, nutrition and hydration.



FIVE DAY CRASH COURSE IN SANSKRIT SANDHI

This course with over 600 takers was conducted by Dr. L. Sampath Kumar (Head of School of Linguistics and Literary Studies).

Sandhi refers to the change in sound, resulting from two letters coming together, rules of which are strictly followed in Sanskrit.

The participants spanned different age groups, ranging from school children to college students, a few Sanskrit teachers and some senior citizens eager to learn the language.



MASTER CLASS IN HINDUSTANI VOCAL, BANSURI AND TABLA

Thirteen students from India and abroad participated in this two-day online programme which had them interacting directly with exemplars in the music field like Professors Vidushi Manjusha Patil, Pt. Rupak Kulkarni and Pt. Abhijit Banerjee.

Students were thrilled to learn from such eminent artists and they are looking forward to future workshops.

EIA DRAFT 2020—FACTS, POLITICS AND BEYOND

The Environment Impact Assessment (Draft) Notification 2020, was introduced by the Government of India for public consultation on 23rd March, 2020, and has been the focus of intense debate since, given its longstanding implications for the future. CVV has also engaged actively in such discussions, spearheaded by the faculty of Public Policy and Governance. In August 2020, CVV and the Centre for Law and Policy hosted a webinar titled 'EIA Draft 2020— Facts, Politics and Beyond', to provide a platform to dissect the legal implications of the provisions of the Draft EIA 2020, and also to address the questions regarding the capabilities of the general public in understanding the policy and the regulations placed for public participation.

Moderated by Asst. Prof. Sreenath Namboodiri, the panel featured a plethora of eminent speakers: Award-winning journalist Nitin Sethi from Reporters' Collective, Shyama Kuriakose, Senior Resident Fellow at the Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy, and Adv. Maitreyi Hegde, Lawyer at the High Court of Kerala and Supreme Court of India.

All the panellists concurred that it was necessary to revamp environmental laws and build a core environmental philosophy to establish a resilient nation and society.



BHARATIYA DARSHANA SHASTRAVALI

'Indian philosophy' is a term that is used quite freely today to mean many things. But what it really is, is not clear to most. To get the myths busted and doubts clarified CVV organised a lecture series called Bharatiya Darshana – An Introduction to Indian Philosophical Systems'.

Eminent scholars were invited to speak on a range of topics, including:

- 'Indian Materialism —Lokayata
- Nyaya Darshana—The Science of Logic
- The relevance of Vedic Karma
- Who is Ishwara—God?
- Decoding Vedanta from various perspectives.
- Messages from the Upanishads relevant for modern education.



KALA SAMANVAYAH

As times change, paradigms of education must change as well. India's updated National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, envisages a holistic education, where different dimensions of learning support each other for the greater growth of the learner. To aid educators transition towards this new system, a unique seminar on art integrated learning, titled 'Kala Samanvayah', was organised in February 2021 by CVV and the Central Chinmaya Mission Trust Education Cell.

Through five sessions covering various subjects taught in schools, the workshop provided a platform for school teachers to learn, up-skill and share ideas and strategies for introducing art organically into the classroom learning experience - in alignment with the requirements of the NEP 2020.

The various sessions focused on Art Integration in Mathematics, Language Teaching, Physics, Computer Science, English, Social Science, Economics, and Business Studies.

The overwhelming response received resulted in another edition of the same workshop being offered two weeks later – Kalasamanvayah 2.

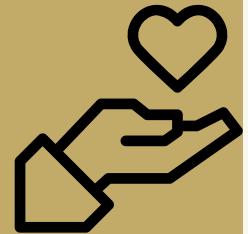

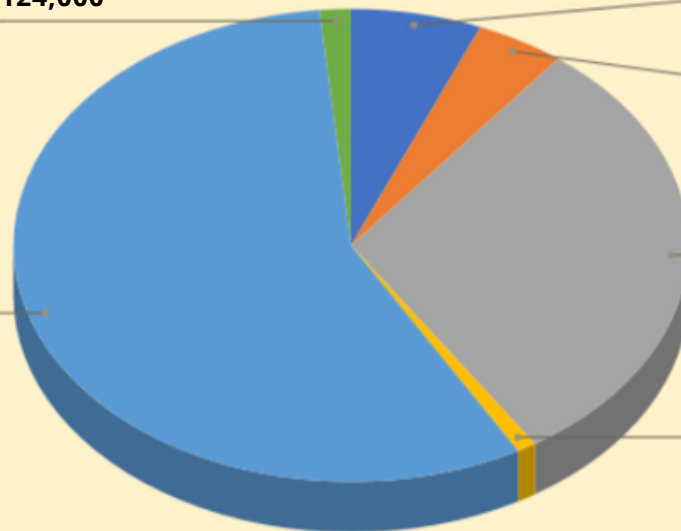

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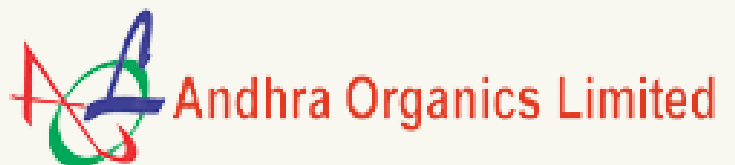

Remembering Dr. Madhuriben Sheth

A long-term supporter of CVV and Chinmaya Mission

Dr. Madhuriben Sheth was a paediatrician in Mumbai and was constantly grateful for having met Pujya Gurudev Swami Chinmayananda when she was in medical college. From that point onwards, Pujya Gurudev and Chinmaya Mission became a significant part of Madhuriben's life, as important to her as family and profession.

Throughout her life, Madhuriben was a generous supporter of Pujya Gurudev's projects. One such was the Sandeepany Gurukula where she for 1 batch she underwrote the entire expense of the students. Hers was not a possessive giving – she made no show of it. Only a few knew it and Madhuriben preferred it that way.

Madhuriben was thrilled when the Government of India approved the establishment of CVV as a Deemed to be University in January, 2017. She was very happy to understand the direction that the University was setting and how it fulfilled Pujya Gurudev's vision for higher education.



Over the next few years, Madhuriben donated a substantial amount to CVV both for the main campus in Ernakulam and for the off-campus in Pune, the Chinmaya Naada Bindu Gurukula.

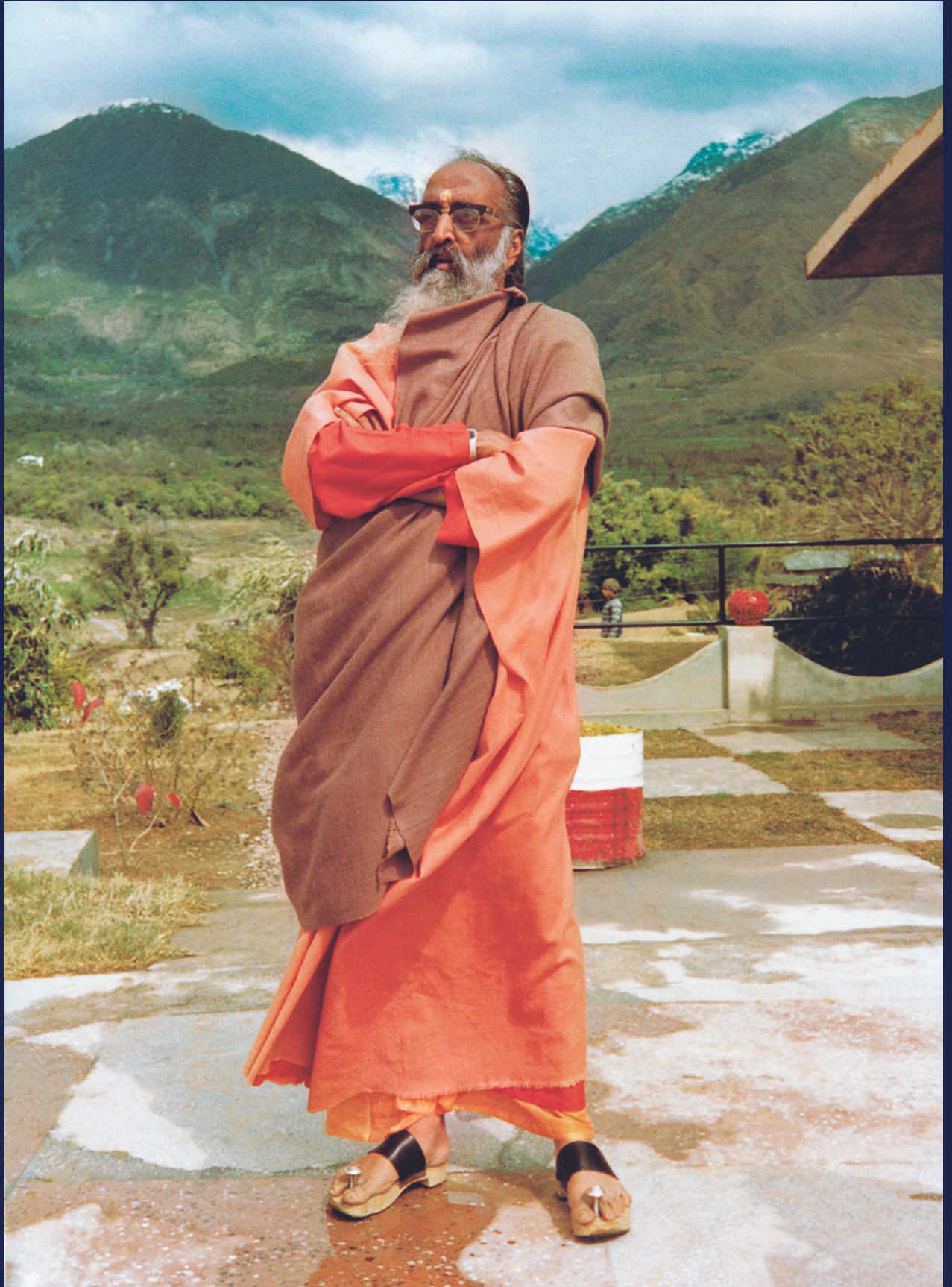
Madhuriben called me in early 2020 as COVID had started ravaging the world. After a brief chat about her health and my family, Madhuriben got straight to the point. "It is time I made my arrangements – I will depart soon. Tell me what is happening at the University." I was stunned and choked at her matter-of-fact tone.

Madhuriben did not even want to discuss a lot of details about how we would use the donation. "I will be travelling to the Powai Ashram in the next couple of days. If possible, I will meet Pujya Guruji in the Ashram and will give him my final donation to the University! If not possible, tell me to whom I should hand the cheque?" I tried to protest as one does when an older person talks about departing this world. I suggested naming something after her or her husband. She declined all such suggestions in a firm tone. Within 72 hours, Madhuriben had handed another cheque with several zeroes to Pujya Guruji Swami Tejomayanandaji in Mumbai.

With this donation, Madhuriben taught me what pragmatic, end-of-life planning is. Madhuriben was diagnosed with cancer in early 2021. Gracefully, with Pujya Gurudev in her heart, the mentor to hundreds of youngsters, a model sevika and philanthropist went to be with her Guru on 22nd June 2021.

Madhuriben's large heart, compassion, love for Pujya Gurudev, immersion in Vedanta, endowed her with the wisdom of giving, the sattvika-danam that Krishna describes in the Bhagavad Gita.
